





A vertical session on peer mentoring was held in Kothari International School on June 25, 2018 in the science department.

The participants performed activities (video recording) to assess themselves on the basis of the parameters stated in the 'Communication checklist'. They discussed the areas where they needed to improve upon.

The post lunch session focussed on the various strategies of teaching Science in the classroom environment and outside the walls of the room. The teachers shared interesting practices which they follow in the classes-

Project method, Explanation, Demonstration, Intense discussions, Activity based learning, QFT (Question Formulating Techniques), Storytelling, Role play, Games (Rapid fire specially for one markers), Hands on experience, Using technology and other teaching Aids to make learning more impactful, were shared.

Emphasis was laid on how to introduce the topic in the class so as to generate curiosity among the learners and keep them engaged throughout the class. The idea of imparting education so as to transform the learners from being "the passive receiver of information to active seekers of knowledge" was the aim of the session.

Mager's tips on instructional objective was also shared and reinforced to make teaching/learning of Science fruitful and meaningful!

The Museum house was a unique collection of science models to arouse interest among visitors. It was a great sight to see the various models of the Equaliser, Xylophone, Electronic Organ and Organ Pipes which involved games and psychomotor skills to enhance learning.

We were fascinated by the Fun Science Gallery as it was full of hands-on exhibits explaining the basic fundamentals of science. We were introduced to the evolution of Communication Technology, the Digital Information Revolution in India, India's contribution to Science and Mathematics, Nobel Prize winners etc.

We had an opportunity to watch mesmerising shows on 'the extinction of Dinosaur' and 'Our Solar System'.

A Demonstration on "the Compressed Nitrogen Gas" and "Contraction of the muscles and its effect" was given by an employee of the NSC, left the audience in awe!

The visit inspired the teachers to motivate the kids in engaging themselves in doing *various* science experiments and do proper research on the niche.

The session was an enriching and fruitful experience!





SALIENT POINTS OF DISCUSSION

MAJOR AREAS OF CONCERN

- It was unanimously agreed upon that the major gaps that need to be bridged is from Grade 5 to Grade 6 and from Grade 8 to Grade 9.
- This is a huge jump and the students have to be prepared to face it with ease.
- Students are unable to write answers with clarity and cannot elaborate.
- The sheer volume of syllabus becomes a deterrent.

PROPOSALS FOR GRADES 4 AND GRADE 5

- Style of writing social science answers has to be taught at this level.
- A standardized writing strategy has to be followed.
- The teacher has to develop the skill of framing questions so that students are trained from this level to answer questions which deal with the 'why and how'.
- True and False questions in Grades 4 & 5 will now have to be clarified by the student ie reason given for why it is True or False.
- Core areas of topics to be emphasized upon.
- Students will be given thorough practice in Political Map of India.

PROPOSALS FOR GRADE 8 AND 9

- Students to be thoroughly practiced in India & World Map.
- Grade 8 Question Paper to be modeled on the lines of Grade 9.Questions for 1, 3 & 5 marks only.
- Syllabus is to be restructured wherever necessary-chapter wise or within the chapter.
- Emphasis to be given on 'Cause and Consequence' of events and relating events/finding parallels in the present.
- Doing research and small projects in the notebook with the lesson to become an integral part of curriculum transaction as also the use of the newspaper.
- Types of Mind Mapping to be shown to students for the entire chapter and for sub topics.
- Teachers must frame questions judiciously.

FOLLOW UP

- At the next Peer Mentoring all the proposals will be reviewed.(are they being followed/difficulties/successes)
- Teachers will go through each other's notebooks.

Ms Anuradha & Ms Dipti will show Grade 11 notebooks to demonstrate how project and research work can be integrated with the teaching of the lesson

She also welcomed the participants and reiterated the importance of organising such workshops.

The session commenced with an ice breaker wherein the teachers were divided into groups and objectives of teaching Social Science were stressed upon. Some of the challenges faced by the teachers were:


- Disinterest in the subject and lack of confidence this could be dealt with peer teaching/mentoring
- How to bring up the achievements of low achievers breaking up a difficult topic into small segments and giving them ample practice in each. Also regular remedial classes could be a solution.
- Marking scheme It was discussed in detail as per the CBSE guidelines. This is to be discussed at the time of paper setting.
- Maths lab activities to be included to ease out the understanding and make the topics interesting.
- Parameters to be kept in mind while framing the question papers.
- For low achievers Proper reporting to HM/Principal & parents and documentation to be maintained by the teachers.
- Inclusion of Mental Maths/Vedic Maths in the worksheets for quick working.

Overall it was a fruitful learning experience.

"THE ONLY WAY TO LEARN MATHS IS TO DO MATHS," by Paul Halmos.

Keeping in view the aspiration of an interface with Mathematics and its application, teachers from Maths Faculty from grade 4 to 12 planned a visit to the National Science Centre at Pragati Maidan Delhi Wednesday, June 27, 2018. A group of 9 teachers, started from School at 9:30 am. We entered the centre, and began our tour with the gallery, "Water: The Elixir of Life". Here, we were told about the critical importance of water in our lives, the current rate of depletion of the water table and the need to educate citizens, in regard to the current crisis.

Next we came upon the ENERGY BALL, where nylon balls were lifted to a height of 13 meters, which armed them with potential energy and then dropped, letting them travel all kinds of paths through systematic and random gates. During the downward journey the balls negotiate several geometric curves- sine, ellipse, cycloid, parabola, involute and spiral. The rolling balls convert energy from one to the other forms of energy.

In the series of galleries, next came the "Heritage Gallery", a rich preserve of our precious heritage. It contained exhibits about India's profound and contribution to Astronomy, Mathematics, Chemistry, Medicine, Metallurgy, Art, Craft and Architecture . Here it was exhibited that India discovered and used number 'Zero' as a part of decimal number system even in 500 AD. Also journey of maths in different civilizations was exhibited beautifully. Theory of Matter and Mathematics in Ancient India was presented in a very effective and interesting manner. Word numerals, big numbers, decimal place value, square root & cube root were few of the exhibits. We watched 3D show on the existence of dinosaurs on earth.

We also visited the most fun gallery of the centre, "Fun Science". A whole world of wonder and amazement awaited us here with many interactive 'hands-on' exhibits. We wanted to try each one!We attended 'THE SCIENCE WORKSHOP' conducted by an experienced demonstrator demonstrating various Science concepts.. One cannot imagine, a needle passing through a balloon and the balloon not bursting? Surprisingly, all this is possible! How? The answer lies deep in science!However what we were most taken up by was the show 'Science on Sphere' was on solar System and was very well explained by presenting the real data and pictures collected from NASA. There was much more to see and experience but time was running short so we left for schoolafter visiting this place, we realised, there are many things, which kids need to know, learn, which they can't learn in school, because, they also have their limitation of time and course. But this place, gives them an insight to a variety of topics. Where not only it is shown in an interesting way, but is also interactive.

A peer mentoring session among foreign language teachers was held in the new building Ground Floor Classroom. French, German and Spanish Teachers sat together for the session.

The discussion began with the challenges faced by each foreign language teacher in classroom transactions. The challenges faced in each grade from 6 to 10 were shared.

A discussion on 'working with texts in languages' was done in which different strategies were discussed on how to introduce Texts in language to improve reading skills among the students.

Other topics for example: How to deal with particular mistakes done by the students in language, understanding of a new culture to help them learn the language in a better way were covered.

When Teachers share their experience, they become better at dealing with difficult situation as they identify common issues they face in their classroom transactions.

It was a great learning experience.

Report on English Spelling Bee Competition.


This is a method of learning with the help of map in an interactive and efficient manner. The students also got to know how GIS (Global Information System) technology is used to bring maps, information/data and computers together.
