ATL lab would teach students essential 21 st -century skills which will help them in developing their professional and personal skills. Skilled India is the need of the hour and each step taken for this dream should be welcomed and we should work towards it together for a better India. The day started with the registration of the invited schools and detailed introduction to ATL Tinkering labs by Mr.Divya Jyoti Mishra (Execution head at Stem Robo) and Mr.Ankit Vishwakarma (Innovation Engineer at Stem Robo). Students were familiarised with “do it yourself” kits and equipment on – science, electronics, robotics, open source microcontroller boards, sensors and 3D printers etc. The bread board circuit was explained on projector and then Kothari students demonstrated the circuit working to the invited students in groups. Working of 3- D printer was explained and it was very fascinating for students to see the 3 dimensional model being developed by the printer.
