The resource person for the session was Mr. Binit Binod who is a Management Graduate from K. J. Somaiya Institute of Management Studies & Research, Mumbai and has done his Engineering from BIT Mesra, Ranchi. He has been extensively working in education domain for the last 9 years and has been mentoring students across diverse levels of competitive exams.</p> <p>During the session, the students were given information about the number of seats in Delhi University as well as the number of colleges- both all girls and co-ed colleges. Delhi University has a total of 83 colleges out of which 23 are all girl colleges.</p> <p>The students were helped in understanding how to calculate the best of four marks according to the subjects opted. English has to be included mandatorily in the marks of best of four. The students were also told about the penalties of percentage deduction in case they opt for a subject they haven’t studied or they want to opt for a stream change.</p> <p>There are 12 sports which have been dropped from the ECA category and the list was shared with the students as well.</p>

KIS believes in saving and nurturing the environment. Keeping this in mind a workshop for teachers and admin staff of KIS was organized on Climate Change.

The session was taken by Ms. Rekha Lulla who is a part of the Climate Change Project Foundation.

Climate change occurs when changes in Earth's climate system result in new weather patterns that remain in place for an extended period of time. Climate change is leading to extreme weather conditions and in turn this is causing very heavy rainfall leading to massive floods, or extreme droughts extending to years together.

A discussion on how this extreme weather condition will have an effect on agricultural sector of the country. Many farmers are committing suicide because of not being able to earn and pay off their debts as they aren't able to grow any crops due to dry lands. Dramatic impacts of climate change can also be seen on the glaciers. In the recent past glaciers have been melting at an alarming rate and if we lose our glaciers it will affect rivers like Ganga, Indus and Yamuna which will lead to 200 million people being affected.

Saving the environment is not just the task of the government, but we individually can also bring about a change in our daily life patterns which can be a stepping stone to work towards saving the earth from severe climate change. Some solutions to climate change as discussed were-

- Use renewable energy like solar and wind energy that are naturally available and are non polluting.



- We also need to at Energy Efficiency, which aims to reduce the amount of energy required to power goods and services.
 - Changing the old bulbs with LED or CFL.
 - Use public transport when available.
 - Plants can be kept at home which also purify the air.
 - We can make better lifestyle choices by saying no to plastic, conserving energy, water, buying local food products.
- This session was an eye opener to the severe climate change that is happening all across the globe.

The tour was an opportunity for students to experience new learning methods, exchange ideas and diverse perspectives on various topics of shared interest, make international friendships, and explore higher education opportunities in Australia. This event was organized by Kothari International School in association with 10dem Education Australia and Narrabundah College, Canberra.</p> <p>Next day we went to Narrabundah College where Ms Harpreet fixed buddies for our students and also provided time tables. Students experienced lessons with their buddies. They shared their culture.</p>	

The similarities and differences were being discussed with lots of enthusiasm. It was an experiential learning for all of us. We also visited popular attractions of Canberra such as The War Memorial, The Burley Griffin Lake, The Red Hill Top, The National Museum of Australia and The Royal Australian Mint House. More importantly, the students visited The High Commission of India where they met the Deputy High Commissioner Mr. P C Karthikgeyan and had a two hour interactive session with him and other officials who are working there to improve the Indo-Australian relations. Also we grabbed the opportunity to witness the live-in-session of the Parliament where the Prime Minister Mr Scott John Morrison, the Opposition Leader Mr Anthony Albanese , Ministers and the members of the House of Representatives. The students had a tour of the Australian National University too where they experienced the life of students in abroad.

On 25th October 2019 the UN Day was celebrated in Narrabundah College which was organized by the teachers and students of the Language Department. The College was looking like a 'Global Village' on this day.
