



6 Jan-2021	<u>Subject Orientation</u>	Parents and Students-Grade 10	<p>A session was organized for Grade 10- students and parents to give them more information about the various subjects being offered in Grades 11 and 12.</p> <p>The main objective was to make the students more aware so that they can make informed choices later.</p> <p>When students come to Grade 11, they will be studying subjects which they have never studied before, for e.g. psychology, entrepreneurship, legal studies etc. Along with this, the old subjects that the students will get to read will also have different dimensions.</p> <p>Keeping the pandemic situation in mind, this time a different approach for the orientation was taken up. A compiled video including the views and discussions of all subject tutors was uploaded on the school YouTube channel. This video link was then shared with parents and students, so that they could view it beforehand and on the day of the orientation their doubts/ questions could be catered to. All the groups of subjects were also shared beforehand with the parents and students, so as to give them a clarity about the subjects to be opted for. English is a compulsory subject for all the groups, and apart from that the students have to choose four more subjects. The students will also be given option to choose vocational subjects, however, parents were requested to check with various universities beforehand to know whether they will be accepted or not.</p> <p>The senior wing teachers also clarified the doubts regarding there course content and the future career offerings related to their subject. Parents and students then had more clarity than before and were asked to get back to the teachers in case of any doubts.</p>	

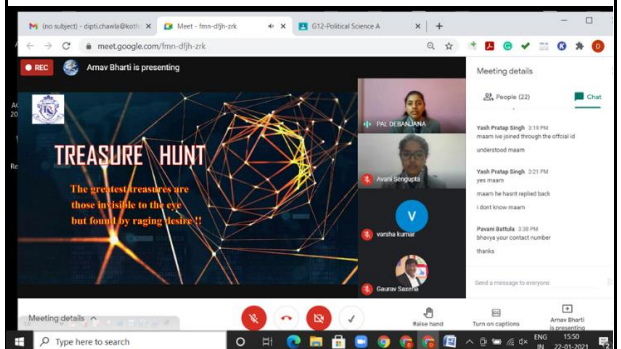
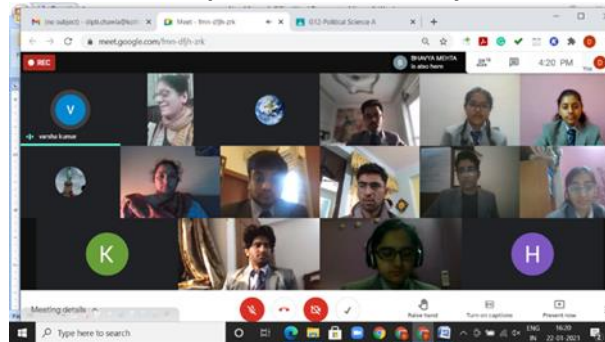


with brain teasing task related to Information & Technology and students participated in it with great zeal and enthusiasm.
